



## STARLINK SET UP

WE RECOMMEND ONLY SETTING UP THE STARLINK ON A PARKED BOAT OR ON A TABLE IN CAMP. DO NOT SET UP THE STARLINK ANYWHERE IT COULD GET SANDY OR WET!

### SET UP

- Open up Nanuk waterproof case and take out batteries and tripod.
- Take Starlink out of its waterproof bag and place upside down on bag.
- Connect tripod to Starlink.
- Turn it over so the tripod is supporting Starlink in a horizontal position (within 10-20 degrees of horizontal).
- Take one of the batteries out of its bag.
- Uncoil the cable that is connected to Starlink and connect it to the battery.
- Press power button on battery. You'll know its on when you see the green % circle.
- Starlink will then take a few moments to acquire a connection with its satellites.
- After a couple of minutes, go to Settings>WiFi on your phone and connect to "Ceiba Starlink #1". No password required. Do not worry that it is an unsecured network - you're in a remote location.
- You're all set up! Anyone that wants to connect can enable their WiFi on their phone and connect to the "Ceiba Starlink #1" network. Everyone on the trip will be able to simultaneously access the internet from their own phone or tablet to make calls, send text messages, check email and browse the web.
- *If you have the Starlink app on your phone and want to fine tune connectivity:*
  - Open up the Starlink app. While holding the Starlink in one hand, use your other hand to loosen the ballhead on the tripod.
  - Align Starlink angle and direction by manipulating the ballhead. The app on your phone will let you know when Starlink is aligned. It is generally a fairly flat angle, within 10-20 degrees of horizontal.
  - Once it is aligned, tighten the ballhead.

### TAKE DOWN

- Turn off the battery by holding the power button in for a couple of seconds.
- Disconnect cable from battery and roll up. ***Do not try and disconnect cable from Starlink!***
- Put batteries in waterproof bags and seal.
- Place Starlink upside down on its bag.
- Unscrew tripod from Starlink.
- Put Starlink in its bag and seal.
- Load Starlink into Nanuk case first.
- Place batteries and tripod where they will fit.
- Take extra precaution when closing the lid that there are no stray bits and pieces obstructing the seal.
- For extra protection, we recommend that the Nanuk case be carried in a side box or 20 mil rocket box when space becomes available a few days in to the trip.
