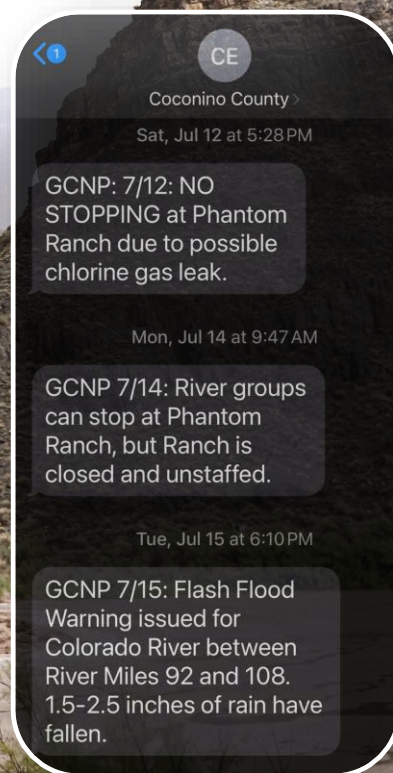

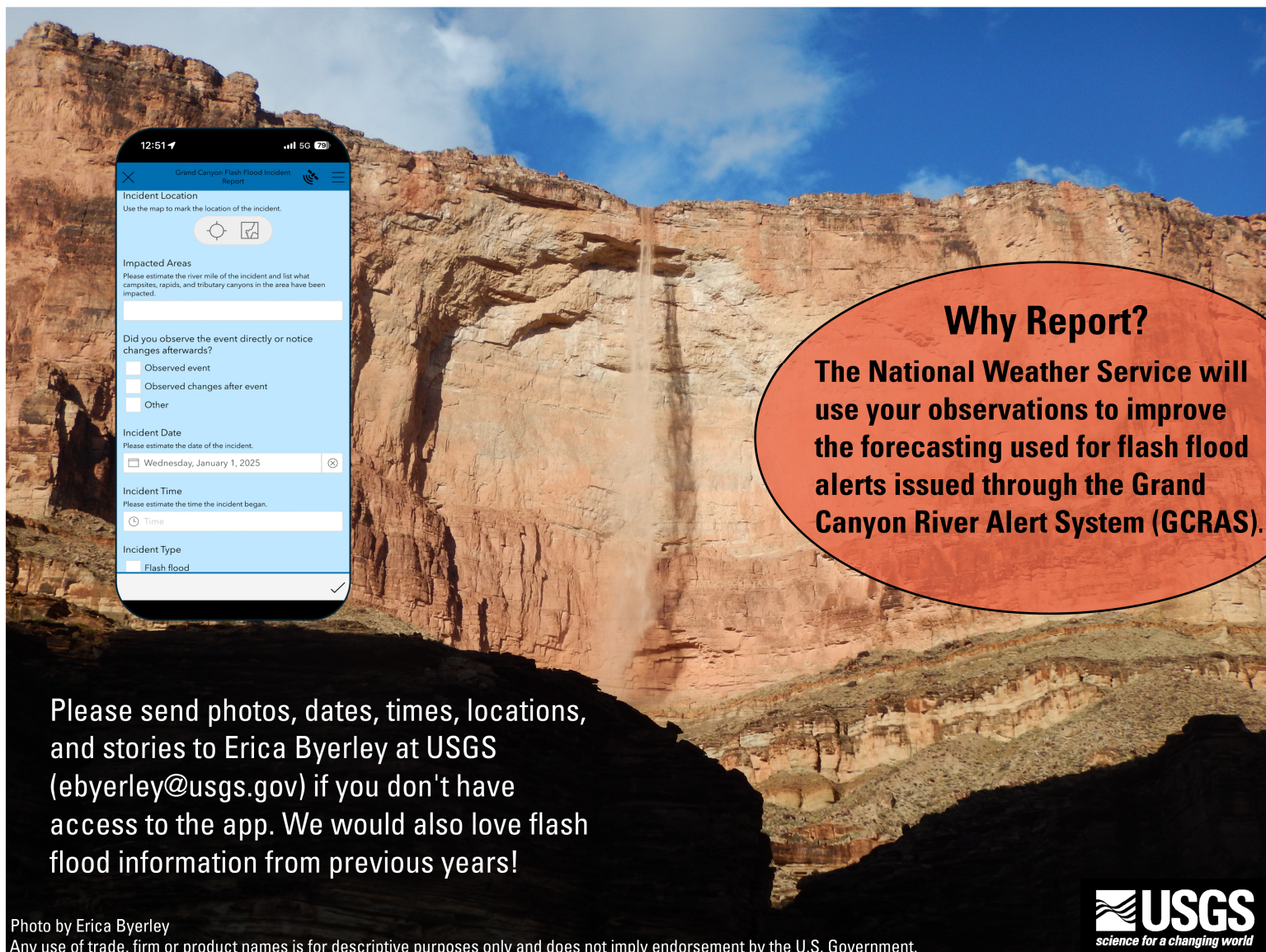
Report Flash Floods and Other Natural Hazards in Grand Canyon

Report flash floods, debris flows, rock falls, and impacts to people, campsites, trails, and rapids!

1. Download the free Survey 123 app and load the "Grand Canyon Flash Flood Incident Report."



2. During your trip, fill out a report with details and photos for each flash flood you encounter.
3. Submit reports when you return to cell phone service.
